The NSPE Southeast Region is Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi, North Carolina, Puerto Rico, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Virginia.
- Attention Young Engineers: Have you graduated from college (undergraduate degree only) in the last 5 years? Did you know you could be saving \$120 on your annual membership dues? To support recent engineering college graduates FES and NSPE membership dues are reduced by 50% for the first five years post graduation.
