



PRESIDENTS REPORT

I'm sure you've all received your membership renewal notices for 2006. I'd like to share some of the success FES accomplished last year in Tallahassee based on your membership.

Consultant's Competitive Negotiations Act

The Consultant's Competitive Negotiations Act (CCNA) was amended positively by Senate Bill 1784. This statute dictates how government entities in Florida procure engineering services. This years changes included amending the definition of "continuing contracts" to provide that firms providing professional services under a continuing contract shall not be required to bid against one another.

Limiting Liability for the Transportation Design Engineer Under provisions of House Bill 1681, a design engineer who contracts with FDOT to prepare or provide engineering plans for construction or repair of a transportation facility - where death, injury, or property damage occurred - shall be presumed to have prepared those plans using a "degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised" by engineers, and with "due regard for acceptable engineering standards and principles" in conforming with FDOT's design standards. Additionally, the bill addresses the issue of liability in civil actions against FDOT, its contractors, consultants, or other agents for a death, injury or for property damage that occurred in a transportation construction zone and involved a driver under the influence of alcohol, or chemical substance, or is driving faster than the posted speed limit. In such cases, it shall be presumed that the driver is the sole proximate cause of the death, injury, or property damage.

Sinkhole Investigation Reports

FES fought to defeat House Bill 365 and Senate Bill 2536, which would have required professional engineers contracted to conduct sinkhole investigations of property to file a report with the Clerk of the Court if one was discovered.

Trust Fund Raids

There were no significant raids on the Trust Funds this year. Legislation did pass that will have Florida spending \$1.5 billion additional dollars in transportation projects this fiscal year and another \$543 million every year for transportation.

I hope this helps you find value in your membership. I encourage you to renew for 2006.


